<b>(2)</b> <b>Experience</b>	<p>2.1) Appropriate 'school experience'.</p> <p>2.2) Experience of reflecting on your 'school experience' and using this self-evaluation to further develop your skills as a classroom practitioner.</p>
<b>(3)</b> <b>Knowledge and Skills</b>	<p>3.1) Understanding of the theory and practice involved in providing an effective child centred education.</p> <p>3.2) The ability to create a rich learning environment through:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>i) managing behaviour effectively to ensure a good and safe learning environment</li> <li>ii) planning, preparation and delivery of programmes of work (to include coverage of the Early Years Foundation Stage/National Curriculum) as appropriate</li> <li>iii) assessing and recording the progress of children's learning in order to inform the next step for teaching and learning</li> </ul> <p>3.3) The ability to teach using a variety of styles and approaches: e.g. whole class, groups, individual.</p> <p>3.4) Knowledge and understanding of the teacher's role in safeguarding and the promotion of the well-being of children.</p> <p>3.5) Knowledge of how a range of factors can inhibit pupil's ability to learn, and how best to overcome them.</p>
